Who doesn't love a great laugh...or an evening in the theater that offers us not only a really good time as the main course, but also some enlightenment on the side? At its core, THE LEGEND OF GEORGIA MCBRIDE is a "feel-good", gender-bending comedy with heart. I can't remember the last time I laughed out loud reading a script. But beneath the fun is an important message about tolerance framed around themes of identity and transformation. Casey's journey of self-acceptance and his emergence as an artist strike a powerful chord with anyone who's struggled to find their true voice. Matthew Lopez manages to tell this story in a way that kind of sneaks up on you. His skill as a writer continues to impress, and with this particular play he reveals his agility as a writer of comedy. Besides a great story, Matthew has also given us a funny and often glorious tribute to the art of drag. Who doesn't love dessert?

Drag is uncomfortable. Creating the illusion that a man is a woman involves moving a lot of real estate – cinching to shape curves, shaving to eliminate hair, and taping to, well.... stow the jewels. A true queen accepts the discomfort because her drag identity is a creative force. Bold identity performance is a personal, empowering act, but it is also a public, political act.

Drag is uncomfortable. A man in women's clothing forces viewers to confront cultural assumptions about gender and sexuality, masculinity and femininity, misogyny and homophobia. A glamour guerilla is outrageous, "in your face," and larger than life; she has the power to stir discomfort and create change.


