My very first signing for my very first book was at a book convention with thousands of people. I put out trays of peanut butter and bacon sandwiches to draw a crowd. It worked. Powerful stuff that bacon but Oy!, my mother would not have approved.

"I want to turn your wonderful book into a play!" he announced.

But we kept talking. One day, before we had even agreed to adapt my book for the stage, he sent me the entire first draft.

Crazy boy was brave! What if I said no?! All that work!

I had no idea how someone might turn my memoir into a three-person play, but once I read Jacque Lamarre's first draft, I was smitten. I was in my hotel room, alone, laughing till I cried, and I wasn't even drunk.

There were many rewrites and tweaks. At every step, he made me feel heard and respected. I think he got more from our conversations than he had from the book.

"Every time I get off the phone with you, the play goes 10 minutes longer!" he'd joke.

The first time I spoke to the rather gorgeous actress playing me, I felt as though I were in an episode of "The Twilight Zone."

But yeah, also kinda fabulous.

My mother had her heart set on leaving me with a guilt complex. As a Jewish mother, that was her job.

Dedicating my memoir to her was my way to honor her, but knowing she will be alive again on stage? It fills my heart with love and matzo balls.

It all feels surreal. How often in life do you go to a play about yourself?!

I keep pinching myself, but if I am asleep, don't wake me. I've had a crazy exhausting life; I need the nap.
