NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

Thirteen years ago, when I was the marketing director for TheaterWorks, I was tasked with the challenge of getting the legendary Joan Didion to do interviews in support of our production of THE YEAR OF MAGICAL THINKING, her monumentally-depressing-book-turned-monumentally-depressingplay. I reached out to Russell Perreault, her publicist at Knopf. I did not hold out a lot of hope that he would help. To my surprise, he did. With Russell's intercession, she agreed to do two interviews. Then she down-shifted to one. Then she backed out altogether. I told Russell that I would personally drive down to his Manhattan office, roll around on the floor, and cry until she capitulated. She did.

Russell and I quickly bonded over my dislike for Joan Didion's cavalier attitude toward my needs. He invited me to visit him at his weekend house in New Milford, CT. It was there that I first saw a copy of I LOVED, I LOST, I MADE SPAGHETTI. I said, "I've never heard of this book. Is it any good?" He replied, pointing at a woman sitting by his pool, "Ask her. She wrote it." This set me on the path to meeting Giulia Melucci and turning her love life into not one, but now two plays. I asked him later if he had read the book and he replied, "I never read my friends' books. That way I don't have to lie and say I liked it."

Russell came to my wedding in Connecticut 11 years ago. He did not go to Giulia's wedding because he refused to go to Brooklyn. Now, thanks to him, we are all invited to Giulia's anniversary dinner. In 2019, we lost Russell at the age of 52. It is to him that Giulia and I lovingly dedicate SECONDO.

Spaghetti has been produced at George Street Playhouse, Asolo Rep, Florida Repertory Theatre, Cincinnati Playhouse on the Park, Greater Boston Theatre Company, Half Moon

Theatre, among others. His comedy Born Fat was workshopped at the Philly Fringe, premiered at Seven Angels, and was remounted for the Midtown International Theatre Festival in NYC (Outstanding Solo Show). Other MITF productions include Save the Robots - The Musical and Gray Matters. His comedy Love & Spumoni premiered at Seven Angels Theatre, where his new comedy Italian Mom Loves You! starring Daniel Franzese opens this August. Jacques has co-written eighteen shows for drag superstar Varla Jean Merman including this summer's Ready to Blow currently running in Provincetown, MA.



GIULIA MELUCCI'S (Author) first book, I Loved, I Lost, I Made Spaghetti, was released in 2008 by Grand Central Publishing. The memoir was translated into six languages and published in eight countries, but not in Italy, for some reason. It did, however, become a successful play written by Jacques Lamarre which premiered at TheaterWorks Hartford in 2012. She is thrilled that Lamarre is birthing a sequel for her, since

she is kind of sick of herself. When she's not outsourcing her creativity, she's a Vice President at Harper's Magazine.



ROB RUGGIERO (Director / Producing Artistic Director) has been part of TheaterWorks Hartford artistic leadership for 29 seasons. He has directed over 65 shows, including TWH productions of Zoey's Perfect Wedding, The Sound Inside, American Son, The Legend of Georgia McBride, Constellations, Next to Normal, Relativity (starring Richard Dreyfuss) and Christmas on the Rocks, which he also conceived.



His Broadway credits include Looped (starring Valerie Harper in a Tonynominated performance) and High (starring Kathleen Turner) which had its world premiere at TWH.
