

She joined *Woody Sez* for its 2007 debut in Edinburgh and for subsequent trips throughout the US, UK, Europe, the Middle East and China. In 2012, she was nominated for a Helen Hayes Award for her work in the show. At home in both New York City and Vienna, Austria, she is very happy to return to **TheaterWorks Hartford** and get the chance to work with all of these folks again.
