A Scottish Thesaurus

MIDSUMMER is filled with the sounds and rhythms of Edinburgh, David Greig and Gordon McIntyre's home town. Get to know your Scots with our mini-thesaurus!

"Aye, the nights are fair drawing in" — a traditional Scottish phrase meaning the days are getting shorter and the nights are getting longer.

Bog-standard — used to describe something which is perfectly ordinary.

Chum — to accompany someone.

Drying Greens — a grassy lawn, most commonly linked to a block of flats, designated for hanging clothes to dry.

Haar — a Costal sea fog, particularly common in Edinburgh.

Jings — an exclamation equivalent to "gosh" or "golly".

Nutter — a person who is mentally ill.

Piss Artist — a storyteller, often a person who is especially loquacious when drinking.

Tesco — a popular grocery store chain in the UK.

The Conan Doyle — a pub located at 71-73 York Place in the New Town neighborhood of Edinburgh.

Waterstone's — a chain of British book stores with a location in Edinburgh at 128 Princes Street which hosts events with authors reading from their works.

Well-Man MOT — MOT technically stands for Ministry of Transportation. A MOT refers to an annual car inspection required for drivers in the UK. Well-man MOTs are health exams recommended for men beginning in their 30s.

The one o'clock gun — a gun fired daily at Edinburgh as a time signal for ships in the harbor. The practice began in 1861.

DAVID GREIG (playwright) David Greig is the Lyceum's Artistic Director (London) as well as an acclaimed and award-winning playwright. His plays have been performed across the UK, at the Royal Court, National, the RSC, and the Traverse Theatre in Scotland, and have been produced and toured around the world. David's plays include *The Lorax*, *The Events*, *The Strange Undoing of Prudencia Hart*, *Dunsinane* and the book for *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* the musical. David writes for screen and radio too and is currently under commission from Hillbilly Films and the BBC.

GORDON MCINTYRE (playwright) is the lead singer and songwriter for **ballboy**, an Edinburgh based band that writes and records story-based guitar pop songs. They have released 5 albums and toured extensively across the UK, Europe and the USA. They have contributed to many soundtracks for film and television. Gordon co-wrote **MIDSUMMER** with David for the Traverse Theatre Company at the Edinburgh Festival in 2009 and it has toured

worldwide since. It has been translated and performed by theatre companies in Italy, Portugal, Germany, Austria, South Korea, Brazil, Ukraine and Canada. The album **MIDSUMMER** is a solo album of songs written for the show.



TRACY BRIGDEN (Director) is thrilled to return to **TheaterWorks** where she directed *Art* in 2000. She has just completed her fifteenth year as Artistic Director of City Theatre Company in Pittsburgh, PA. Most recently at City Theatre, she directed *The Last Match* by Anna Ziegler and the world premiere of *Some Brighter Distance* by Keith Reddin and a production of this play, **MIDSUMMER (A Play With Songs)**. Past City Theatre credits include: *Outlying Islands* and the American premiere of *The Monster in the Hall*, both by David Greig, as well as world premieres by Michael Hollinger, Christopher Durang, Adam Rapp, Eve Ensler, Jeffrey Hatcher and Eric Simonson among others. Prior to coming to Pittsburgh, Tracy was Associate Artistic Director of Hartford Stage and Artistic Associate for Manhattan Theatre Club. Other directing credits: include productions at both regional and New York theatres, including Atlantic Theater Company, TheatreWorks Palo Alto, Westport Country Playhouse, Hangar Theatre, CATF, and Pittsburgh Public Theater. Awards and honors include Pittsburgh Magazine's "40 Under 40" and the Connecticut Critics Circle Award for Best Production and Best Director and finalist for the 2014 Zelda Fichandler Award.



ROB RUGGIERO (Producing Artistic Director) has been a part of **TheaterWorks** artistic leadership for 23 years. He has directed over 50 shows, including this season's *Sex with Strangers*, *Buyer & Cellar* and *Third*. Rob has earned national recognition for his work on plays and musicals. His Broadway credits include *Looped* (starring Valerie Harper in a Tony-nominated performance) and *High* (starring Kathleen Turner). Off-Broadway, he conceived and directed the original musical revue entitled *Make Me a Song: The Music of William Finn* (Nominated for the Drama Desk and the Outer Critics Circle Awards). Rob conceived and directed the world premiere musical portrait of Ella Fitzgerald entitled *Ella*, which was seen on more than 24 regional theater stages from 2005-2010 before beginning a National Tour. His work has received multiple awards and recognition here in Connecticut, as well as in other cities around the United States. Rob's prolific collaborations with Goodspeed Musicals include *La Cage aux Folles*, highly successful productions of *Fiddler on the Roof*, *The Most Happy Fella*, and a new adaptation of *Show Boat* (all winners of Connecticut Critic's Circle Awards for Best Direction). 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

Celebrations of Midsummer in Scotland date back to prehistoric times marking the start of the harvest season and the gradual shortening of days. It is believed to be a time when the veil between the mortal and faerie worlds is permeable, hence the inspiration behind Shakespeare's *A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM*.

Greig and McIntyre's *MIDSUMMER* nods to the festivals and the play's Shakespearean namesake, but the script is steeped in the cityscape of Scotland's capital. Edinburgh is an enticing landscape for a theatrical playground and one that *MIDSUMMER*'s Bob and Helena, explore with abandon.

From its center, Edinburgh sprawls out in a patchwork of neighborhoods ranging from the West End where *MIDSUMMER* begins in a cellar wine bar to Helena's tony Marchmont neighborhood and Bob's working class Leith docks.

Helena and Bob's madcap weekend and their journey are intimately tied to the geography and character of this unique landscape. Both thirty-five, they are in the midsummer of their lives on an odyssey that celebrates the wonder of life while gently acknowledging its fleeting nature.

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
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
